 Before any decisions are made the City Council must be aware of the Community's priorities

# Community's Quality Of Life Service Needs and Priorities

- Residents identified the following quality of life service priorities:
  - Rapid response to 9-1-1 emergencies
  - Maintaining the number of police officers on neighborhood patrols
  - Maintaining crime prevention and investigation programs
  - Maintaining fire protection
  - Maintaining city streets and roads, and repairing potholes
  - Maintaining the long-term financial stability of the City

Top 5 Priorities from Community Feedback Survey

- Maintaining City streets, roads and repairing potholes
- Rapidly responding to 9-1-1 emergency calls
- Maintaining safe, clean reliable local water supply
- Maintaining fire protection services
- Managing growth to maintain neighborhood character



#### What We've Heard

Top Comments From Community Feedback Survey

- Better management of growth
- Solving traffic problems in Morgan
   Hill
- Police/Fire and safety are very important
- Preserving open space and agricultural land



#### What We've Heard

Themes From Presentation

- More affordable senior housing is needed
- Concern about new development and water supply
- Need for more affordable housing in general
- Interest in knowing PCI for County roads in Morgan Hill



#### What We've Already Done **Enhancements to Public Safety**

- Hire a full-time Public Safety **Dispatch Supervisor**
- Purchase Patrol rifles specific to each officer for personalization of weapon
- Purchase a used reserve fire engine as a back-up to the City's existing Fire Department fleet

# What We've Already Done Enhancements to Public Safety

- Purchase Automated External
   Defibrillators (AEDs) for all Police
   Department Patrol vehicles
- Body-worn Camera upgrade (BWC)



Invest \$1 Million annually for the repair of our streets
