Just voicing my concerns here as a MH resident.

I am unable to attend the May 18 City Council meeting, but I want to state for the record that I am against raising the allotment level for the remaining years of the current RDCS to 282 as indicated in the Planning Commission recommendation.

This increase, in fact any increase, that goes above the currently applied limit of 250 does not in any way support the City Council's publicly stated position of being responsible growth managers.

Unless there is a rational explanation as to how such an increase is beneficial to the residents of Morgan Hill, the Planning Commission putting forth such a recommendation is ridiculous and should not be considered acceptable by the City Council.

Thank you for your time I accept growth, but if they don't have a reason justifying the increase as a benefit to the residents then they are clearly pandering to developers.

I additionally don't see development of housing as sustainable development or long term revenue for the city. Eventually the city wont be able to build anymore and income has to come from tax revenue which is best collected from a strong business base.
