- Project is now ready to move forward



- Long Term Improvements to the Downtown Area Infrastructure







### Restrooms

- Proposing new self cleaning with security measures
  - Requested by the community
  - \$262,000 Construction Cost
  - \$25,000 Annual Operational Cost

## **Purchase Water District Property**

- 2 Pieces of Property for \$126,000
  - Connection to Second Street
  - Bike Hub/Gateway to Creek Park

### **Bridge to Second Street**

- Provides connectivity between Second and Third Streets
- Formalizes current unmaintained creek area

## **Other Key Park Amenities**

- Slide on Hilltop Trail
- Play Equipment at Depot Park
- Bike Hub/Gateway to Creek Park
- Public Art

## Non Park Amenities Improvements

- Third Street Bridge
  - Enables transition to a one way street
  - Key for pedestrian path
  - Long term fix that improves emergency access

- Third and Del Monte Street Improvements
  - Repairs one of the worst streets in the City
  - Improves pedestrian access
  - Necessary for Hilltop Trail

### Non Park Amenities Improvements

- Del Monte between 5<sup>th</sup> St. and Dunne Ave.
  - Key for Pedestrian Path to Hilltop Trail
  - Long term fixes to an area with no sidewalks and curbs
